and Auxiliaries assisted with the backpack stuffing event. There were active military, therapy dogs, students and other organizations assisting with the packing. Dixie W. had donated 6 blankets and we had other items donated towards the backpacks. Everyone had fun, we stuffed 250 backpacks to be distributed to the wards in the VA Hospital. The VA crew graciously provided snacks and drinks for us. Posts/Aux represented were 2111, 1512, 9578, 11437, 3787 and Coronado. Great turn out, lots of items! On 12/25, Christmas morning, Dixie W. (Chaplain at Aux 3788) and I went up to the VA Medical Center to help my other veterans' group, Jewish War Vets, distribute 300 gift bags to the veterans at the hospital. We covered 8 sections within the hospital for the distribution to include Spinal Cord Injury, Palliative Care, Acute Wards, Psych Ward and the ADT Physical Therapy. Had lots of fun, met some of the veterans who were happy to see the turnout from JWV (and both of us representing District 1 VFW Auxiliary). We even sang Happy Birthday to a Vet whose family could not make it to see him that day. Very rewarding experience.

We will be expecting our Department Auxiliary line officers during the weekend of January 15-17, including their visit to the VA Medical Center (I'm making arrangements to meet them once I get the specific date/time). We will also need to discuss doing the 3rd Saturday of the month 'burgers and dogs' cooking.
