The San Diego airport staff and the **Volunteers of the Honor Flight of San Diego** make sure the events of the trip move smoothly (the regular volunteers have done this several times). They are very well-organized on this great Honor Flight so that the WWII, Korean, and Vietnam War Veterans can participate. Some Vets need wheelchair assistance 24/7; others, just a few times a day if it will be a long walk (and/or to get there sooner). **Mary Ann** and I were very excited, but there was no rush to get on the plane. We both got an aisle seat next to each other

Our Aux Chaplain **Jan Bazardorf** and I (momentarily stepping out of Aux President mode to be Dist. 1 Chaplain) read the Jewish prayer for the deceased in **Chris's** honor. Not a dry eye in the house, as everyone loved the prayer.

Auxiliary sister **Gloria Rivera's** creation of the buddy poppy wreath has been received to present to the District for the contest on Nov. 3rd.

Also, thanks to **JR Bailey** for his suggestion to have an event in memory of **Pearl Harbor Day** Saturday, Dec. 7 to coincide with meetings. He will need assistance and volunteers to put together a ceremony, as he mentioned he would bring in a guest speaker to discuss his/her memories of that fateful day.

We enjoyed a humbling arrival of patriotism, clapping, and cheers when we arrived in Washington D.C. The hotel and meals for the Honor Flight San Diego were amazing. **Mary Ann** and I became "roommates" in a hotel. We had a gorgeous dinner that included active duty presentation of insignia, and people that were thanked for their participation of all Honor Flights around the country. They do this every day all over the USA to get these **War Heroes** to Washington D.C.!!


Saturday was an early and very busy day. . We had breakfast, and then our three buses of Veterans and Guardians from San Diego were escorted by Active and Retired Policemen on motorcycles from Baltimore, to Washington, D.C.

We first went to Arlington National Cemetery. **Mary Ann**, the other female Veteran **Mary Jane**, her guardian **Lisa**, and I, along with the Volunteers of the Honor Flight, got to be escorted through the Women in Military Service for America Memorial. Both **Marys** got to see their picture and member information on a screen that they had submitted years ago, and were taken a tour of the entire memorial. It was really cool for me, because I was the youngest Veteran, and I was there with the only two women Veterans of this trip.

We then met back up with our bus. Then, the Police Escort for all three buses came - greatest ride of the trip driving through the city! We had a guide to tell us what we were driving by the entire day.

We then went to **Iwo Jima USMC Memorial, Air Force Memorial**, saw the **Pentagon, White House** (from afar), **Washington Monument, Capitol Building**, and the **Navy Memorial Plaza**.

We finally arrived at the **WWII Memorial**. We then took a group photo of all 120+ people who were on this **San Diego Honor Flight**. Then we were told to find **Kilroy!**

Mary was able to meet a current active Cryptologist that is in the Navy. They were both amazed about the technology each of them used, both old and new.

On our way back to our Baltimore hotel, we still had a police escort. We arrived home quick to have a quick rest, and then another beautiful dinner. Each of the Veterans received a bag full of memorabilia of Washington D.C items, coins, and now had memories of new friends and this amazing trip!

Coming home to San Diego, everyone anticipated the arrival of the big "Welcome Home." We came down the escalator with 1,000 people greeting us. Video cameras, cheering, family, friends, strangers, shaking hands, taking pictures, hugs, and a sense of overwhelming happiness was all included.

This entire experience was amazing and I encourage everyone (who is able) to sign up or donate to this great cause. The Veterans that may not have been originally welcomed home get the greatest trip and welcome home of a lifetime.
