Meet Post Commander Jack Gauthier

"I decided to join the **Naval Reserves** when I was a young high school student in my junior year. That was on December 2, 1963, the day after my 17th birthday. I attended Drills in **Longview, Washington**, where I lived. During the summer of 1964, I attended six weeks of **Boot Camp** at **Treasure Island** in **San Francisco**. Then I went back to high school for my senior year. Since I was not the best of students, I did not have enough credits to graduate in June of 1965, so I had to repeat some courses to finish with enough credits. So between my first and second senior year of high school, I was sent to **San Diego** for **Firefighter and Damage Control** school. I returned to high school to finish my senior year while in the reserves and also worked nights at the local drive-in movie theater. I graduated in June and was called to active duty on the **USS Canberra** (named after the **HAMS Canberra** that sunk during WWII) in August and went straight to Vietnam and served two tours onboard her. I was

"When I dropped out of college in 1961, I realized the draft was coming, so I enlisted in January of 1962 and completed basic training at Fort Jackson and advanced training at Fort Gordon. I was placed with 7th Army 25th Signal Battalion at Kaiserslautern, West Germany. I went to German Language school because I knew my wife was coming to live with the Germans. In December of 1962, I was placed on TDY to the MPs to work with law enforcement. The Status Of Forces Agreement with Germany gave the German police more authority. In June 1964, I was sent to Fort Riley with the 1st Infantry Division. Later I was sent to Eglin Air Force base to train for jungle warfare in order to go to Vietnam. My life plan was to make a career of the Army. My wife found out that I would have to re-enlist to go to Vietnam and told me that I went she wanted a divorce. My first child was already 2 years old. I left the Army. I had a successful business career and retired in 2006.

When visiting San Diego several years ago, I found a wonderful small town named Alpine that had a local VFW post that was looking for a Quartermaster. Alpine is a great place to live and the Post is my true love."

Armed Forces Day is May 16

Among the many military holidays celebrated each year is Armed Forces Day. Celebrated the third Saturday in May, Armed Forces Day falls during **Military Appreciation Month** and joins **Memorial Day**, **Military Spouse Appreciation Day** and **Victory in Europe Day (V-E Day)** as another May military-themed holiday.

The History of Armed Forces Day

On Aug. 31, 1949, **Defense Secretary Louis Johnson** announced the creation of an **Armed Forces Day** to replace separate **Army**, **Navy** and **Air Force Days**. The single-day celebration stemmed from the unification of the armed forces under one agency -- the **Department of Defense**.

In a speech announcing the creation of the day, **President Truman** "praised the work of the military services at home and across the seas." He said, "It is vital to the security of the nation and to the establishment of a desirable peace." In an excerpt from the **Presidential Proclamation of Feb. 27, 1950**, **Truman** stated:

"**Armed Forces Day**, Saturday, May 20, 1950, marks the first combined demonstration by America's defense team of its progress, under the **National Security Act**, toward the goal of readiness for any eventuality. It is the first parade of preparedness by the unified forces of our land, sea, and air defense."

SD County HSD Recommendations

We urge all to follow the basic steps recommended by the San Diego County Health Services Department:

How to protect yourself

Practice everyday preventive actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory viruses, including:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer. It should be at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- **Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces often.**
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- If you are sick, stay home and keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Practice other good health habits. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids and eat nutritious food.

April 27th SDC Health Order Update

Starting Monday, April 27, the following will be allowed in the ocean and bays: swimming, surfing, paddle boarding and kayaking. Recreational boating is still banned. However, each city is responsible for deciding whether to open its beaches. Check before visiting. Beach parking lots need to remain closed.

Starting May 1, some restrictions will be relaxed for parks and golf courses if they can enforce social distancing. Operators of a park or golf course need to create and post a plan for how they will do that. Social distancing and safety templates for

What the SDC Health orders mean

- Everyone needs to stay home except to take care of essential needs or go to an essential job.
- Practice social distancing. Keep at least six feet away from other people unless they're household members. Avoid gatherings of any size.
- You should wear a face covering when leaving home. Cloth facial coverings don't have to be medical grade but should cover your nose and mouth. Homemade masks, bandanas, scarves and neck gaiters are OK since you can wash and reuse them.
- It is strongly recommended you stay home, unless you need medical care, if:
 - You are over 65 years old
 - Have a chronic underlying health condition
 - Have a compromised immune system
 - Have mild to moderate symptoms of COVID-19

parks & beaches and golf courses:

If they maintain social distancing:

- Parks can reopen parking lots, with limitations.
- Park visitors can sit, lie down, picnic if they practice social distancing.
- Members of a family or household can play active sports, such as basketball.

Starting May 1, everyone must wear face coverings anywhere in public they come within 6 feet of another person.

What's been closed?

- Dine-in areas of restaurants
- Bars and nightclubs.
- Gyms and fitness centers
- Hair and nail salons
- Entertainment venues
- Beach and public park parking lots. Some parks are closed.
- Public events and gatherings

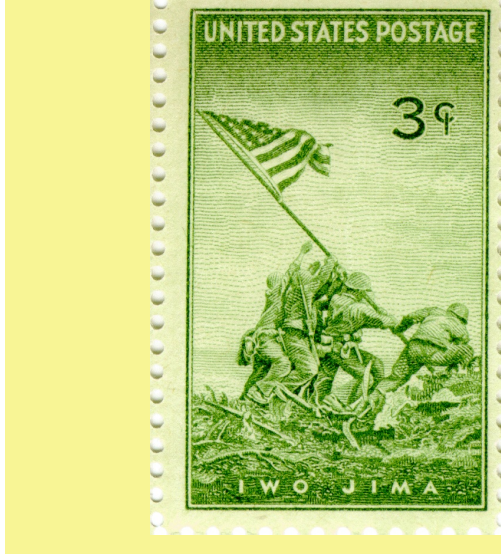
What is open?

You need to follow social distancing when you visit these essential services, including:

- Grocery stores, farmers markets, food banks, convenience stores
- Restaurants for take-out, delivery or drive-through
- Pharmacies
- Banks
- Laundromats/laundry
- Hardware/home improvement stores
- Airports and public transportation
- Childcare (see below)

Essential government services are still available. Many government agencies have closed public offices but are offering services online, over the phone or other ways.

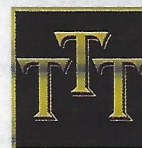
