

President Signs COVID Relief Package into Law

Congress passed and President Biden signed into law the "American Rescue Act" (H.R.1319-COVID relief package). The bill provides additional resources for the VA to continue vaccinating veterans and VA staff, as well as potential improvements to bolster the nation's vaccine supply chain. A breakdown of VA provisions is available from the FRA.org website.

The relief package includes an FRA-supported provision that closes the so-called 90/10 loophole. Currently, for-profit schools must collect at least 10% of their revenue from non-federal sources. The 90/10 rule does not count the **GI Bill** as federal revenue, despite it coming from the **Department of Veterans Affairs**. The relief package provides \$1.9 trillion in spending in numerous government programs that include:

- Providing economic impact payments of \$1,400 for individuals/\$2800 for those making up to \$75,000 for individuals and \$150,000 for couples;
- Delivering a \$300 weekly supplemental unemployment compensation payment until September for unemployed individuals;
- · Exempting student loan forgiveness payments from taxation;
- · Providing a 100% subsidy of COBRA health insurance premiums for laid-off workers can keep healthcare coverage through the end of September; and
- Expanding child tax credits and SNAP (Food stamps program).

Bipartisan Bill Expanding COVID-19 Vaccine Access for Veterans and Families

Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee (SVAC) Chairman Jon Tester (Mont.), Sen. John Boozman (Ark.), SVAC Ranking Member Jerry Moran (Kan.), and Sen. Richard Blumenthal (Conn.) introduced bipartisan legislation that would expand COVID-19 vaccine eligibility to veterans and their families under the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

The "Strengthening and Amplifying Vaccination Efforts to Locally Immunize all Veterans and Every Spouse (SAVE LIVES) Act" (S.682) would allow the VA to provide no-cost COVID vaccination services to all veterans, veteran spouses,

who attended and participated both in person and on the phone. It was great to have sunshine, fresh air, and light breezes and where everyone was glad to see Auxiliary members who had not been seen for some time.

We held a fund-raiser bake sale in conjunction with **St. Patrick's Day** dinner, on March 17. Those who participated brought in their goodies after 2 p.m., and sales went from 4 p.m. - 6 p.m. with the incoming folks wanting to have some dinner and perhaps a little dessert to go!

We had a great turnout at the Bake Sale; we raised funds with proceeds pending assignment at our April meeting. This included a monetary donation from one of our Auxiliary members who was unable to participate; and we were sincerely appreciative of the check!

Many of our new members participated as well, got to meet them and will be coming to our meeting in April. If you see one of our new folks, please reach out to greet them with a warm welcome!

Our Department Chairman for Youth Activities Diana Kulhanek spoke about two programs in which students would be able to participate with entries due by March 31 for consideration. One was called "Get Excited for Red, White and Blue" (National Anthem singing contest) and the other was "Illustrating America" (art contest). Both contests have monetary gifts. Our treasurer Michael B., who is an instructor at a local high school, hopes to convince the choir director to have some students contribute their singing talents (choice of genre). The flyers were mailed out previously for all Aux members and their children to review for consideration.

Program reports are updated for this year, and the deadline is April 10th for any last-minute submittals. A report regarding **Buddy Poppy** distribution was sent in as **Vikki** give each meeting attendee (total of 16 on site) a **Buddy Poppy**.

For the April meeting, we will have officer nominations and elections for the upcoming year which runs from July 2021 through June 2022.

All positions are open for members in good standing (meaning your dues are current); so please give some thought and participation to becoming a line officer. This is when you attend, have your voice/vote heard for one of the positions you may be

caregivers, and Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs (CHAMPVA) recipients to the extent that such vaccines are available. The legislation also urges the Department of Health and Human Services to adjust the VA's vaccine allocation based on this increased eligibility pool, as much as the supply chain allows.

Similar legislation (H.R.1276) sponsored by **House Veterans Affairs Committee**Chairman **Mark Takano** (CA) has passed the House. This bill would provide vaccines to veterans who are enrolled in the VA health care system, and veteran caregivers.

SVAC Hearing on Toxic Exposure

The Senate Veterans Affairs Committee held an oversight hearing to discuss the experiences of veterans living with exposure to Agent Orange or Burn Pits, and the lifelong health consequences of the exposure. The hearing also examined the scientific evidence related to these exposures and their health outcomes. Chairman Jon Tester (Mont.) said we have not learned our lesson from Vietnam. There is too much arguing over the science and too much red tape. Ranking Member Jerry Moran (KS) noted those who are sick from exposure have been met with barriers to care from the VA. Witnesses include a Vietnam War veteran testifying about Agent Orange exposure, an Iraq War Veteran testifying about burn pit exposure, veterans' advocates and medical experts.

The **FRA** is a member of the **Toxic Exposures in the American Military** (TEAM) Coalition and wants to ensure that no veteran who had exposure to burn pits or other environmental toxins goes without access to VA health care benefits. The FRA supports oversight hearings on the negative effects of these hazards, and what steps the **VA** is taking to get veterans who are affected by burn pit exposure to get the care they need. The burn pit registry was created to allow eligible veterans and service members to document their exposures and report health concerns through an online questionnaire. FRA members can register with the burn pit registry by going to www.FRA.org






