

signed in 1953.







the world! She picked my Dad to marry, so I believe he was all I wished he would have been to her and his seven children. I'd really like to think that my Dad was the most wonderful person that ever lived, but I don't know that. Because for my Father, the War changed him, like so many others. He suffered in ways I will never know but still try to understand.

Life was hard for my Dad, every single day. You could see it on his face. My memories of him are... keeping to himself, always with a mildly frustrated or sad look. Deep in thought, with seven rowdy kids running around a very small home. Today, none of my siblings remember him being playful, or talkative, or even at peace with himself or his surroundings. My Dad was not mean — he was in pain. Deep, long term pain, 38 years worth of pain. My Dad worked hard — every day. He had a couple of acquaintances, but no true friends. No one to talk with about what he, and they, had been through.

My Dad had just turned 59 when he passed. PTSD was not a "thing" in the 40's, 60's or even 80's. Now we know, now we listen, now we are more educated, now there is help. We realize what we asked our young men and women to do for us, for our Country – still do – and it has serious ramifications to some.

I am truly grateful that I am involved with the **VFW** and see firsthand what was, what is, and what could be. Now I can at least understand a little and hopefully help a lot.

We heard this week that one of my daughter's classmates committed suicide. He was a **Marine**, formerly worked for the police department and he was in his early 30's. This brought back so many painful feelings about how he must have suffered, how my Dad must have suffered, and how no one was able or willing to help them, or thousands of others like them. **We have to do better than that.** 

This **Memorial Day** we will remember all those who died in our world conflicts. And those that died at home long after the conflict had ended. We must all make a pledge to help our Brothers and Sisters who are in need. We can pledge to be more aware, engage them in conversation to let them know we are all here to help. Don't let another day go by without praying for our Military. For this world to be at peace. For not one more person to feel so hopeless that they perish under our watch. We must remember and act.

#### **History of Memorial Day**

**Memorial Day** is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military.

Originally known as **Decoration Day**, it originated in the years following the **Civil War** and became an official federal holiday in 1971. Many Americans observe **Memorial Day** by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings and participating in parades. Unofficially, it marks the beginning of the summer season.

#### **Early Observances of Memorial Day**

The **Civil War**, which ended in the spring of 1865, claimed more lives than any conflict in U.S. history and required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries. By the late 1860s, Americans in various towns and cities had begun holding springtime tributes to these countless fallen soldiers, decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers.

Did you know? Each year on Memorial Day a national moment of remembrance takes place at 3 p.m. local time.

It is unclear where exactly this tradition originated; numerous different communities may have independently initiated the memorial gatherings. And some records show that one of the earliest **Memorial Day** commemorations was organized by a group of formerly enslaved people in **Charleston**, **South Carolina** less than a month after the Confederacy surrendered in 1865.

Nevertheless, in 1966 the federal government declared **Waterloo**, **New York**, the official birthplace of **Memorial Day**. **Waterloo**, which first celebrated the day on May 5, 1866, was chosen because it hosted an annual, community-wide event, during which businesses closed and residents decorated the graves of soldiers with flowers and flags.

## **Decoration Day**

On May 5, 1868, **General John A. Logan**, leader of an organization for Northern Civil War veterans, called for a nationwide day of remembrance later that month. "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land," **Logan** proclaimed.

The date of **Decoration Day**, as he called it, was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle. On the first **Decoration Day**, **General James Garfield** made a speech at **Arlington National Cemetery**, and 5,000 participants decorated the graves of the 20,000 **Civil War** soldiers buried there.

#### **Memorial Day: A Federal Holiday**

Memorial Day, as Decoration Day gradually came to be known, originally honored only those lost while fighting in the Civil War. But during World War I the United States found itself embroiled in another major conflict, and the holiday evolved to commemorate American military personnel who died in all wars, including World War II, The Vietnam War, The Korean War and the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

For decades, **Memorial Day** continued to be observed on May 30, the date **General Logan** had selected for the first **Decoration Day**. But in 1968, Congress passed the **Uniform Monday Holiday Act**, which established **Memorial Day** as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees. The change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared **Memorial Day** a federal holiday.




